WEEK OF September 15 'OUTRO' ~ Finish Strong/Start Renewed Hebrews 12:1-3/ 2 Timothy 4:1-8

Day 1:

Depending on how you feel, the end of a season can go three ways.

- ~You may be optimistic, excited even, if there's new things ahead.
- ~Or, you may be tentative, a bit sad, overwhelmed with the endless "what ifs" running rampant; essential uncertainty in the unknown.
- ~the third; you're indifferent, time is always moving, so dwelling on what was, or is yet to be, is irrelevant; keep rollin!

The goal with this **Summer Devo Series** was to lend structure, when our daily routines suddenly leave us hanging.

Day 2:

New Testament Holy Spirit

The Church Outro - End Strong/Start Renewed

Did one Theme challenge you more than the others? Did a specific topic push your buttons? Make you think, or step out and make some changes?

We have the ability to never stop learning, and You are the Greatest Teacher, Lord! Maybe one of the coolest things is that if you picked up this same series next summer, you'd be in a different place, and your answers would be different. Isn't God so cool and gracious to us that this is the case?

CHALLENGE:

For the rest of your time today, go back and revisit one of these themes, and see if anything you've been challenged to think through, or apply to your life, has continued to be an active part of your days!

²Let us fix our eyes on Jesus,

the author and perfecter of our faith,
who for the joy set before him endured the cross,
scorning its shame,

and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

What a passage!

There is so much going on here.

Statements.

Encouragements.

Challenges.

TRUTH.

Let's dissect this a little more closely:

¹Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses,

~We are not alone. There is a war going on in the heavenlies.

Church, we can't see it, but

if we pay attention we can feel it. It matters how we engage in battle.

This is a Truth Statement.

There is a battle going on for our souls, at this moment; you are fighting this fight, whether you truly engage or not.

let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out or us.

~Where is your focus?

Are you pursing the Lord?

Confession and Repentance are key to following Jesus. *Repent* is, after all, the first command Jesus gives us before He says, "Come, follow me," (Matthew 4:17 & 19 NIV)

²Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

~He went to the cross for us.

Fix your eyes on Jesus.

³Consider him who endured such opposition from sinful men, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

~Focus on Him. Consider Him. Keep your eyes on Him.

What is one thing you can do today to align your heart, mind, and spirit with Him?

Day 4: Outro-End Strong/Start Renewed

Write it down, as well as a list of questions you'd like to pursue.

Maybe you send these questions to church.

Maybe you bring them to your ministry leader to work through.

Check out a book from the library.

Resources are in endless supply these days.

Don't stop your pursuit of The Lord.

That is what chasing Jesus looks like.

You ask. He answers.

Also, just FYI, there are no bad questions.

Ask.

Seek.

Knock.

Sound familiar?

REFLECTION:

Spend the rest of your time today talking to Him.

Asking for guidance.

Reading through the passages that stumped you, or challenged, or encouraged you.

Write down your thoughts, questions, and prayers.

Day 5:

Remember this from way back in early June?

PRAYER & FASTING

Monday~ PRAYER AND FASTING (Corporate: THE CHURCH) (fast and ask the Lord to show you how to pray for these young people, our families, our church, and our community)

Tuesday~ Marriages/Families at EFC

Wednesday~ Seniors

Thursday~ Youth/Young Adults

Friday~ community/country

Saturday/Sunday ~ Sabbath: pray as led

If you choose, do a short 1 meal fast today.

Spend your time with the Lord today, praying through these 4 (Tuesday-Friday).

Everybody needs prayer.

But this prayer focus is less about personal circumstance and need, and more about spiritual growth and wholeness.

Take your time today to talk with Jesus about these areas of concern, and the direction our church is leading in these ministries.

Day 6:

1In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge:

²Preach the Word;

Be prepared in season and out of season;

<u>correct, rebuke and encourage –</u> with great patience and careful instruction.

³For the time will come when men will not put up with sound doctrine.

Instead, to suit their own desires they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear.

⁴They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths.

⁵But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.

⁶For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time has come for my departure.

7I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.

8Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness,
which the Lord, the righteous Judge,
will award to me on that day – and not only to me,
but also to all who have longed for his appearing.

2 Timothy 4:1-8 (NIV)

This may be Paul's charge to Timothy, but it is still relevant for us; and, as it says in the previous chapter, only 2 verses before:

2 Timothy 3:16 (NIV)

¹⁶All Scripture is God-breathed and <u>is useful for teaching, rebuking,</u> <u>correcting and training in righteousness,</u> ¹⁷so that the <u>man of God</u> may be thoroughly <u>equipped for every good work.</u>

The *man of God*? That's you.

Who needs <u>teaching</u>, <u>rebuking</u>, <u>correcting</u> <u>and training in righteousness</u>, <u>and thorough</u> <u>equipping</u>? Still you!

We are in a battle, church.

We are running a race.

It may seem long, and require periods of rest.

But those rest stops DO NOT mean STOP.

We prepare – EQUIP, TEACH, REBUKE, CORRECT AND TRAIN IN RIGHTEOUSNESS

We take up our cross.

We follow Him.

EVERY DAY.

FULL STOP.

So, as we pass the baton, from one season to the next, from easy-breezy, sometimes willy-nilly, summer commitment, to the intense race that September brings. Train hard.

Show up to practice.

Surround yourself with other believers who help you on your journey.

Spend more time in The Word.

Volunteer somewhere in the Church.

Build up those reserves for whatever has yet to come.

We are never truly in an "off-season".

It's always harder to get back into shape, than to have stayed the course.

So church, take up this mantle and run well:
